Another point of pride for our school each Spring that validates our consistent academic achievement and educational rigor is our IOWA Test School report. CKRS IOWA Test results for 2018 have just been electronically released to the schools who participated in this year's battery of tests. The teachers and I are in the process of reviewing both individual student performance as well as class summary profiles however overall we as school continue to have an overwhelming majority of our student population scoring above the national and state average in all core academic areas, with many scoring in a superior range. With further review, we as a faculty will further analyze the scores and then discuss and discern the best ways to design and deliver any curriculum or core content areas that might need more attention in terms of future mastery for each grade level. For you as a parent, the important thing for you to do is to look at your own child's progress and mastery in the academic areas being tested. Their purpose does not lie in comparing your child's results to classmates' or siblings' scores but in identifying academic areas of strength and weakness that your child as a developing learner may enhance, reinforce and remediate. We will send home your child's results as soon as we receive the individual paper forms for distribution.

Tickets for our Sand Dollars 50/50 Raffle went home last week. We really need each and every CKRS family to help with this critical fundraising effort. Our hope is to realize a significant profit from this raffle in order to finance some much needed improvements to our school plant that were budget for this school year. Last year, with the help of a generous grant from the Hocker Foundation, we were able to install upgraded security doors throughout our school. Presently we are in the final stages of installing a panic alarm system to allow an automatic lockdown of our building and further insuring the greater safety of all our children if ever a true crisis situation presented itself here at CKRS. We are only able to do these types of important impacting improvements because of fundraising efforts such as this. This year we are targeting cafeteria window replacement with new window units with bulletproof glass. This is an expensive expenditure that again only due to the generosity of an alumni benefactor whose \$10,000 gift is being used to supplement the NJ State security grant we received, outs this important safety upgrade project within our financial reach if each of us do our part to bring our projected profit from this fundraiser into fruition. We have a little over a month left to meet our goal of the needed \$10,000 that will enable us to fully finance this window replacement project using revenue from this year's budgeted money. I have great faith and hope in your resolve to make this a fundraising a success and our school safer for all our CKRS children. Only a few will win a prize from the raffle however all of us will win greater peace of mind knowing we have contributed to making our school a safer place for all our CKRS children.
